

Baja What to Bring List

Bring:

2 quart plastic water bottle(s) or hydration system
Sunscreen and lip protection
Sunglasses with strap, strap for regular glasses
Hat for sun
Non-cotton shirt for paddling
Quick-dry shorts/pants
Paddle jacket
Water shoes or sandals with heel strap
Bathing suit
Towel
In-camp shirt (s)
Warm camp shirt
Windbreaker jacket
Long warm pants
Socks
Underwear
Warm hat for evening
Beach / light hiking shoes
PJs
Sleeping bag
ThermaRest
Tent, bivy, or tarp (gets chilly & dewy at night, could rain)
Ropes (12-24") on tent to tie to sand anchors (anchors provided)
Personal hygiene (NOT Dr Bronners soap! It doesn't work in salt water. Trust me.)
Toothpaste & tooth brush
Shampoo, soap (or just use Mexican dish soap. Works fine)
Camera, film
Medications
Sense of adventure!

Optional:

Comb or brush
Binoculars
Wetsuit for snorkeling/ rolling a lot
Snorkel gear
Fishin' stuff & lots o'luck
Favorite snacks
PFD
Paddle
Sarong or wrap (handy for so many things; sold in Loreto)
Journal, book

Compact beach seat
Any clothes you'd like in town
Duffel for carrying everything between kayak & camp
